Consider potential players' school and life "loads":

To be successful, a player needs to:

have the time

make the commitment

not short-change other aspects of their life, especially their studies.



Send evites to all registered student organizations and deliver leaflets about HCASC at their meetings. Get the fraternities to challenge the sororities, etc.

Send out an announcement about HCASC to be read in classes and invite faculty to nominate students.

Check out which students are watching Jeopardy!, put up table tents in the lounge and put doorhangers on door.



Invite SGA to field a team, ask them to put an announcement in their newsletter and submit a proposal for funding for your HCASC Academic Club.

Staff a table at orientation and show the HCASC video and send evites to all new students.

Play the HCASC "Get in the Game" video and the "Game Demonstration" video on big-screen TVs, play the HCASC Rap over the PA system, stage demonstration matches, etc.

In addition to fliers & posters, print bookmarks with info about playing HCASC and distribute them at book check-out stations.

Run the HCASC Question of the Day videos during meal times, put table tents on the tables or print tray holders with info about HCASC.

An e-blast from the president will get the faculty's attention.

Last year's players and those who have now graduated but are still in town are a great source of referrals.
